## AENEID

The Department of Classics and the Art Studio are sponsoring an art contest for students at high schools, art schools, and universities in conjunction with Vergil Week. Held in late April, Vergil Week celebrates the poetry, the life, and the world of the ancient Roman poet Publius Vergilius Maro, or Vergil. The art contest encourages students to create new artwork inspired by Vergil's *Aeneid*, Vergil's Rome, or Greco-Roman mythology. Artists are especially encouraged to represent characters and scenes from Book Three of Vergil's *Aeneid* such as gods and goddesses; heroes and heroines; and monsters like the Harpies and the Cyclops.

1. Artists must complete and submit the registration form. Download the registration form at [classics.case.edu/vergil-week](http://classics.case.edu/vergil-week).
2. The artist must be able to send by mail or deliver the work to the CWRU campus on or before the deadline of Friday 15 April 2016 at 5 p.m.
3. Artwork will be judged by a panel of CWRU graduate students.
4. The artwork may be in any 2D pictorial or 3D sculptural medium:  
Pictorial works must be matted and no larger than 18" x 24"  
Sculptural works must be no heavier than 50 lbs.
5. There will be two categories of competition: high school students and university students (undergraduate and graduate). Three prizes can be awarded in each of the two categories:  
University/Art School: 1st place, \$125; 2nd place \$75; 3rd place \$25  
High School: 1st place, \$100; 2nd place \$50; 3rd place \$25
6. Prizes will be awarded on Monday 18 April 2016 at the CWRU Art Studio.

\*Drawings done at the Cleveland Museum of Art on Sunday 17 April 2016 in conjunction with the special session of Drawing in the Galleries will be eligible for the contest and can be submitted at the museum. Each contestant is urged to bring a matt for the drawing he or she plans to submit.
